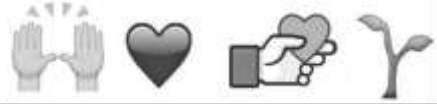

**\*HIGHLIGHTS OF PCC MEETING ON 7 MARCH\***

- Beverley Hunt was welcomed to her first PCC meeting in the parish
- A draft budget for 2017 was submitted showing an overall parish deficit of £13,000
- Foundations will be returning to St Peter's Church Centre in September 2017, mornings only
- A Church Development Plan outlining key plans for the parish in 2017 was agreed. It replaces our Mission Action Plan and will be sent to the Diocese as all parishes have been asked to produce one and submit it. Details will be circulated in a note for the churches soon
- Jonathan has applied to the diocese for a curate to the whole parish starting in July 2018
- Ideas were shared for events during 'Thy Kingdom Come', a national prayer initiative between 25 May and 4 June, which Beverley will co-ordinate

**RACHEL'S RAMBLINGS**

*One of my passions is bell ringing. Like anything involving teamwork it doesn't always go so well, as you've probably noticed! But other times everything goes right and it's the most amazing thing to be a part of, creating something that's far more than the sum of its parts.
