



MICK'S MUSINGS

At Easter time we focus, quite rightly, on the resurrection. Perhaps we do not think about the resurrection the rest of the year; this is a possible reaction to the "pie in the sky" philosophy. In the early days the disciples preached a lot about the resurrection of Jesus of course but also the promised resurrection for all who followed him. (Acts 10:40 and Acts 2:29).

1 Corinthians 15 has more to say on this. "But how shall we recognize him? We don't know what he looks like and do we rely on looks?" The disciples on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus didn't recognise the risen Lord Jesus (Luke 24:6); they did recognise him when he gave them the bread that he blessed and broke.

Stephen saw the risen Lord Jesus standing at the right hand of God ready to welcome him after he, Stephen, had been stoned to death. John also saw the risen Lord Jesus in a vision.

Jesus was among the church people and he could see their need. So, if among risen you see someone moving among the people welcoming and giving, do what John did. (Rev 1:17-19).
