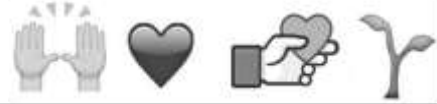

Starting from *St Peters at 9.30am tomorrow, Monday 1 May*, we will first visit the Henry VIII Palace, walking alongside the Wey, and then carry on along footpaths to St Nicholas' Church in Pyrford, arriving at about 11 o'clock. After a brief visit, and some reflections on possible historical connections with St Peter's and also with Newark Priory, guided by Anthony Morton, we will proceed on minor roads and footpaths to view the Priory across the meadows from the historic Wey Navigation near Walsham Gates, and then walk back to Old Woking along the canal to the New Inn at Send, for suitable refreshment at 1.00pm for those who wish to stay, where they have reserved some tables for us.

A short post prandial stroll back to St Peter's via the former Unwins print works should see all arrive home somewhere between 3.00pm – 4.00pm.

Please wear comfortable walking shoes, not sandals, and bring your own rain or sun protection clothing according to the weather on the day. The walk will take place in whatever Bank Holiday weather that we find we have been blessed.
